

Online Bachelor's Degree

Everyone has a dream to go to college and have a degree. Well, you don't have to travel to the university you want to attend to, because there are a lot of universities that are offering online degree courses. Attaining a degree has never been easier than it is now, with many universities now offering online bachelors degree programs.

Online bachelors degree programs are par of e-learning, learning is facilitated through, and based on both computer and communications technology. The Internet, email, discussion forums, collaborative software and team learning systems have opened a gateway for people to gain access to a number of educational courses and degrees. Online Bachelor Degree is one of them.

The internet has allowed students to study remotely at home and work at their own pace. When taking the traditional route, a bachelors degree takes minimum of four years, and many times it takes closer to five and six years to complete. By getting your online bachelors degree, you can work as little or as much as you want, and many times can complete an online bachelor degree in fewer than the traditional four years. A great number of students are non-traditional older students, who are married and have families in addition to a full time career. Two years or at least 60 semester credit hours of general education is required in addition to the sixty or sixty -five credit hours required for completion of a bachelors degree in any chosen area of study. Online bachelor degree programs should be accredited and promote academic excellence. The credits earned at these online institutions should easily transfer to traditional schools, and a degree earned online should be treated as the equivalent of earning it in an on-campus setting. Therefore, it would serve as a prerequisite to pursuing a masters or doctorate degree, which you can also complete online.

The most important four criteria for choosing the source of your online degree should help you choose the best degree and university for you. First, when choosing to get an online bachelor's degree, the first thing you want to consider is what do you want to study? Most online degrees focus on accounting, business, management and related fields of study. If any of these appeal to you or can help you move up at work, you may want to consider which one you want to tackle.

Second, check out the online schools. Are they accredited? Wasting money on a school that no one will recognize won't help you. Accredited schools meet certain criteria with the Department of Education and the Higher Commission for Learning. Alternatively, you may choose a school that is accredited with the Distance Education Training Council (DETC). While many employers recognize DETC schools, the credits may not transferrable to a traditional university if you choose to pursue more education later.
